Introduction

Covid-19 is a new illness that can affect your lungs and airways. It is caused by a virus called Coronavirus. Symptoms can be mild, moderate, severe or fatal.

Also reminded to catch coughs and sneezes in tissues – Follow Catch it, Bin it, Kill it and to avoid touching face, eyes, nose or mouth with unclean hands. Also relocating workers to other tasks.</p> <p>Redesigning processes to ensure social distancing in place.</p> <p>Conference calls to be used instead of face to face meetings.</p> <p>Ensuring sufficient rest breaks for staff and crew.</p>	<p>Rigorous checks will be carried out by studio managers to ensure that the necessary procedures are being followed.</p> <p>Staff to be reminded on a daily basis of the importance of social distancing both in the workplace and outside of it.</p> <p>Management checks to ensure this is adhered to.</p> <p>Encouraging hirers to use our "Remote Studios" capability to view your shoot rather than attending the studios in person.</p> <p>Talent will be given their own dedicated microphone for audio recordings.</p> <p>Talent will be encouraged to attach their own microphone.</p>

Anyone else who physically comes in contact with you in relation to your business. 	<p>Wearing of Gloves Where Risk Assessment identifies wearing of gloves as a requirement of the job, an adequate supply of these will be provided. Staff and visitors to the studio will be instructed on how to remove gloves carefully to reduce contamination and how to dispose of them safely.</p> <p>RPE Public Health guidance on the use of PPE (personal protective equipment) to protect against COVID-19 relates to health care settings. In all other settings individuals are asked to observe social distancing measures and practice good hand hygiene behaviours Where RPE is a requirement for risks associated with the work undertaken the following measures will be followed- Tight-fitting respirators (such as disposable FFP3 masks and reusable half masks) rely on having a good seal with the wearer’s face. A face fit test will be carried out to ensure the respiratory protective equipment (RPE) can protect the wearer. Wearers must be clean shaven.</p>	<p>Staff, crew and visitors to be reminded that wearing of gloves is not a substitute for good hand washing.</p> <p>To minimise the risk of transmission of COVID-19 during face-fit testing the following additional measures should be carried out – Both the fit tester and those being fit tested should wash their hands before and after the test.</p> <p>Those being fit tested with non-disposable masks should clean the mask themselves before and immediately after the test using a suitable disinfectant cleaning wipe (check with manufacturer to avoid damaging the mask). Test face pieces that cannot be adequately disinfected (e.g. disposable half masks) should not be used by more than one individual. Fit testers should wear disposable gloves when undertaking cleaning of the tubes, hoods etc. and ensure they remove gloves following the correct procedure (PDF) Referenc: https://www.hse.gov.uk/news/facemask-ppe-rpe-coronavirus.htm</p> <p>Internal communication channels and cascading of messages through studio representatives will be carried out regularly to reassure and support those using the studios in a fast changing situation.</p> <p>Make-Up And Wardrobe will be encouraged to wear PPE at all times</p>

Line managers will maintain regular contact with staff members during this time.</p> <p>If advised that a member of staff or public has developed Covid-19 and were recently on our premises (including where a member of staff has visited other work place premises such as domestic premises), the management team of the workplace will contact the Public Health Authority to discuss the case, identify people who have been in contact with them and will take advice on any actions or precautions that should be taken. https://www.publichealth.hscni.net/</p>	Studio managers will offer support to hirers who are affected by Coronavirus or has a family member affected.
